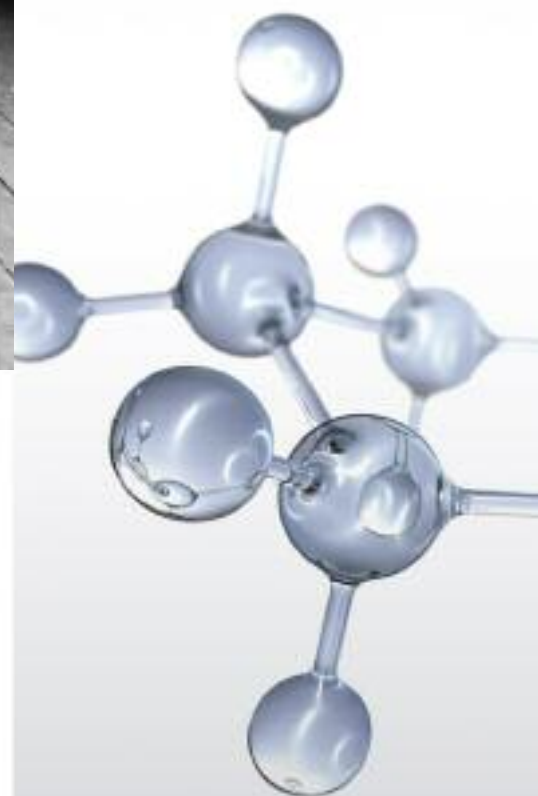


# Looking back over 60 years

Great Britain is a country of enduring industrial tradition, and one whose people have been responsible for important breakthroughs in the fields of engineering and science.

But 60 years ago the nation faced a series of huge challenges: including how to meet a burgeoning post-war energy demand. The Fawley Refinery and Petrochemical Plant was built to help the nation avoid an energy shortfall.

Today it is one of the largest in the UK, and one of the most complex in Europe, processing 330,000 barrels of crude oil daily. Over the next few months, while we celebrate the Refinery's 60th anniversary, Community Matters will focus on the men and women who built the refinery, and the challenges of working in such a specialised environment.

# You could make a difference

Employees at Fawley took part in free first aid courses run by St John Ambulance towards the end of last year.

The charity provides first aid training to hundreds of thousands of people each year. It believes that nobody should die because of a lack of on-site first aid training.

A number of two-hour courses were held in the area surrounding Fawley as part of the charity's 'Being the Difference' campaign. This initiative was strongly supported by the refinery's Healthy Living Group (HLG). The first 20 employees who applied for and completed a course were provided with a free first aid kit.

Fawley employee, Ian Cressey, said: "Having been a St John volunteer, I've seen the difference that a knowledge of first aid can make - both through providing it myself and also from what I've seen 'bystanders' do prior to my arrival at an incident. Knowing even basic first aid can make a difference. I'd encourage everyone to at least visit the St John Ambulance website and get the guide. It could be you that makes a difference!"

Nigel Hickey, one of the employees who attended the course, commented: "I attended the St John first aid course

in Romsey and found it very worthwhile indeed. It was the most important and relevant two hours I have spent in a long while, and I would thoroughly recommend it to others."

# Lab achieves safety milestone

In January, the ExxonMobil Chemical Limited Lab (EMCL) celebrated three years without any injury (either requiring first aid or Worse Than First Aid). Lab Supervisor, Phillip Cheshire, said: "This is an excellent achievement by the laboratory staff. It reflects the significant effort made by all members of the team in making the Lab a safe place in which to work and in looking after the potentially vulnerable people who regularly visit the Lab to perform maintenance activities."

During this three-year period, a considerable amount of work has been carried out. This has included the complete



refitting of the Lab during 2008 and 2009 as part of the amalgamation of the Basic Chemicals Intermediates (BCI) and Butyl laboratory operations.

Phillip continued: "Efforts in the areas of CARE, housekeeping, safety audits and safety walkabouts have all played a major role in keeping the Lab staff safe and sending them home injury-free at the end of every day. I would like to congratulate them all for their excellent efforts to date and I wish them well as we progress on the journey to four years without injury and beyond."
