After two successful inaugural cruises from Hamburg to West Africa and South America, the S/S *Hamburg* steamed toward the New World. Arriving in New York on June 26, 1969, the superbly appointed vessel received the city's traditional salute and escort to her berth at Pier 40, North River.

Owned by Deutsche Atlantik Linie of Hamburg and built at Howaldtswerke-Deutsche Werft AG at Hamburg, the \$24 million liner has the following vital statistics:

The vessel is powered by two Mobil-lubricated AEG 11,500-ihp steam turbines giving her a cruising speed of twenty-three knots. Equipped with A.E.G. stabilizers, she will be a wonderful rider in heavy seas. She may only meet them on a rare occasion, but when she does, she will be well prepared.
